

Position: Field Technician - Greater Sage-grouse Habitat Surveys

Description:

The Oregon Natural Desert Association (ONDA) is seeking energetic and motivated field technicians to conduct spring and fall monitoring of vegetation transects in eastern Oregon. The survey effort is part of a larger project monitoring habitat characteristics important to the life history of the Greater Sage-grouse. A typical work week will be 40 hours and involve traveling and camping in eastern Oregon for 4-5 day periods. Field vehicle, equipment and survey training is provided by ONDA. The field season consists of two survey periods, two months in the spring and two months in the late summer/fall with the potential for other opportunities between survey periods.

Location: Office: Bend, Oregon / Field sites: Eastern Oregon

Start Date: April 15th

End Date: November 1st (July and August not included in work period)

Compensation: \$12- \$14/hr, food and travel

Requirements:

Qualified applicants will have experience identifying Great Basin and/or Intermountain west plant species; working in remote locations; following survey protocols; operating 4-wheel drive vehicles in adverse conditions; and using a GPS, maps and compass. Applicants must be in good physical shape and have the ability to walk 5-10 miles over varying terrain in adverse weather conditions. Valid driver's license is required.

This position requires technicians to work in remote locations with limited or no services available. Qualified applicants will be able to work independently and as part of a team, making decisions in a safe and efficient manner to achieve project objectives. Background in natural resources, biology, botany or related field will be given preference.
